



 - PIAAC as a prompt for mapping basic skills (joint EU challenges, facing the challenge is diverse in Member States)

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

Upskilling Pathways: new opportunities for adults

- Close to one fifth of adult Europeans struggle with basic reading and writing, calculation, using digital tools in everyday life.
- Helping adults acquire a minimum level of literacy, numeracy and digital skills and/or acquire a broader set of skills by
 progressing towards an upper secondary qualification or equivalent (level 3 or 4 in the European Qualifications Framework
 (EQF) depending on national circumstances).
- Three key steps:
 - Step 1 Skills assessment
 - Step 2 Learning offer
 - Step 3 Validation and recognition
- Delivering the initiative is based upon:
 - effective outreach,
 - guidance,
 - support measures.



Communication on the European Skills Agenda

- The European Skills Agenda pursues a real paradigm shift in skills to take advantage of the green and digital transitions and support a prompt recovery from the COVID-19 crisis, by:
 - strengthening sustainable competitiveness, to achieve the <u>European Green Deal</u> and putting its digital and industrial strategies into practice
 - ensuring social fairness, putting into practice the first principle of the <u>European Pillar of Social Rights</u>: access to education, training and lifelong learning for everybody, everywhere in the EU
 - building up resilience to react to crises, based on the lessons learnt during the COVID-19 pandemic
- In this context, following the <u>European Digital Strategy</u>, the new <u>Industrial and Small and Medium Enterprise</u> <u>Strategy</u> and the <u>Recovery Plan for Europe</u>




