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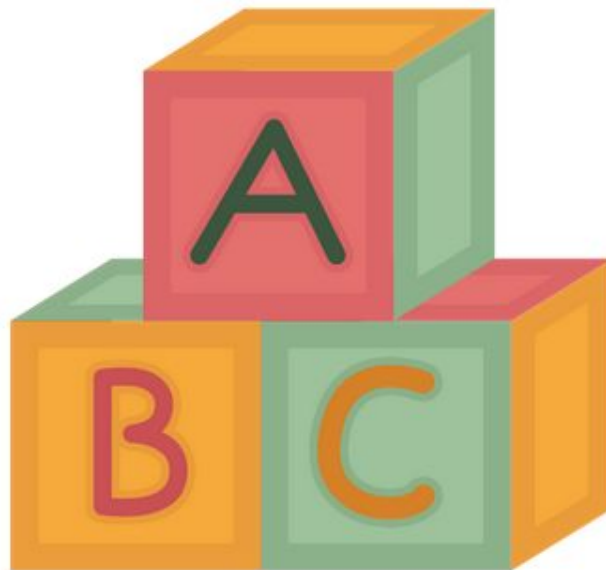
# Basic Skills Using a Computer

## Introduction

The module “Basic Skills Using a Computer” introduces you to computers, a computer mouse, a keyboard, to Windows Operating System and its very basic functions and programs such as MS Word program.

The computer and smart devices have become an integral part of everyday life of people all over the world. It is a tool that enables us to reach an ever-increasing flow of information and helps us accomplish many tasks in our everyday lives. Nowadays many services provided by the national and local governments are offered through the use of Information and Communications Technology (ICT) including E-commerce or E-banking services what allows people to reach them without leaving their homes. This makes our lives more convenient on condition that a person has basic skills to use a computer.

The module will help you to gain basic skills needed to work on a computer.



## Computer - meaning what exactly?

Making the most out of a personal computer (PC) can eliminate the clutter and confusion of everyday life. It can replace the daily planner, address book, phone book, calendar, notepad, files, folders, papers and more. You can use your PC to watch TV and DVDs, listen to music or the radio, organize your photographs, send mail and even call long distance.

The best way to learn about and become comfortable with computers is to start with the basics. Important parts of a computer that one should know include the computer case, the central processing unit (CPU), the memory or RAM, the monitor, the keyboard, the modem, and the mouse.

Depending on the size of the device, the size and performance of the computers built into it also differ.

The personal computer is either available as a laptop so that you have a screen, input devices and hardware in one component.

The desktop PC requires additional peripheral devices such as the mouse, keyboard and monitor so that you can work with it.

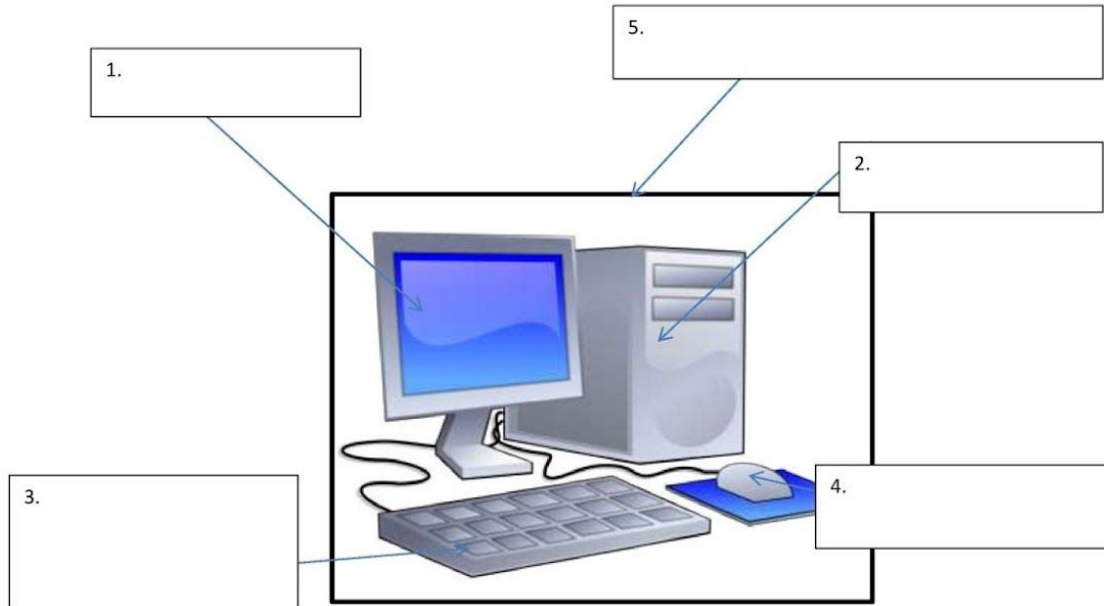

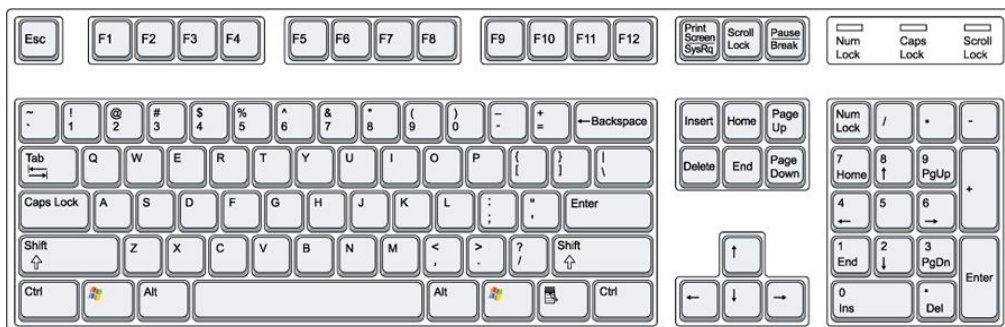

## Keyboard

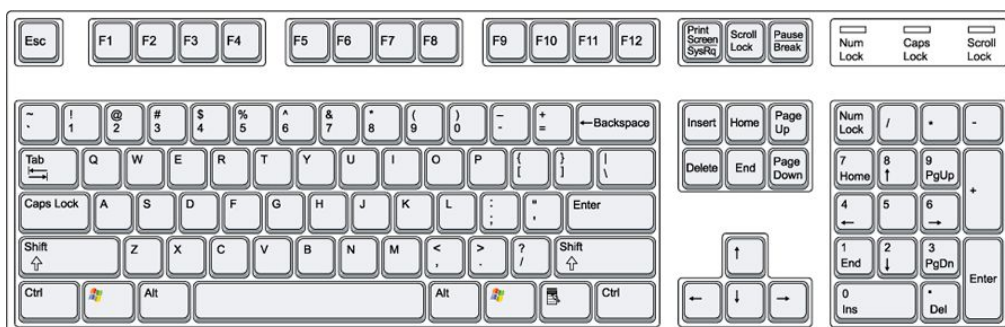

# Information searching

## Introduction

One of the main and needed uses of the internet is a way to find out information, obtain and process information on the Internet. There are millions of websites providing free information, and a search engine is a way to find the website you're looking for.

How do you search for information online? What are the ways for searching things online? What are "keywords? Will it make my life easier? How not to get lost in the information available online?

The main aim of this module is to learn how to search for information on the internet, use search engines, search for things by key words.

**We will focus on the following steps:**

- **Basics of searching for information on the internet - where?**

## **Basics of searching for information on the internet - where?**

### Internet search engine

The search engine - the gateway to the world of the Internet, whether on your home computer or mobilephone: to find what you are looking for in the wealth of content on the Internet, there are search engines. The best known search engine is Google, but there are also search engines from other providers such as Microsoft (Bing) or Yahoo.

Search engines are comparable to a kind of information that searches the Internet for you. For example, you can query the football results of the last match day or cooking recipes in a search engine, for example by entering "Recipe Strawberry Jam" in the search field. The search engine provides you with the answers to your search in the form of references to Internet pages, so-called "links".

The use of search engines is free of charge, but the little helpers mainly make their money by showing advertisements and collecting data. If you want to search more anonymously on the Internet, you can use data protection-friendly search engines such as Startpage, forward the search terms to Google as an intermediary and thereby anonymize them.

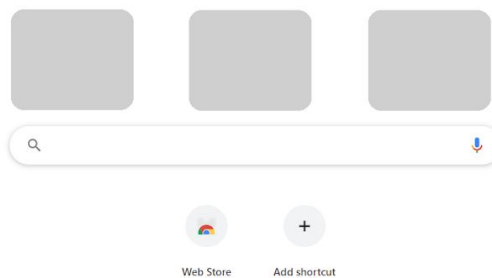
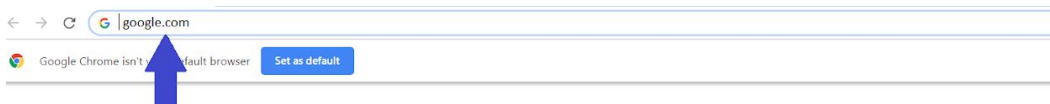


**Where to find search engine? In one of the web browsers.**

The browser - the tool for surfing the net. Those who use the Internet are mostly on the world wide web. This is called “surfing” (read: surfing) because you move around the Internet like a surf rider, not just in the sea, but freely on different computers within the large global network. There is a simple rule: If you want to view websites, you need a special program, a browser, in addition to a computer, smartphone or tablet with Internet access.

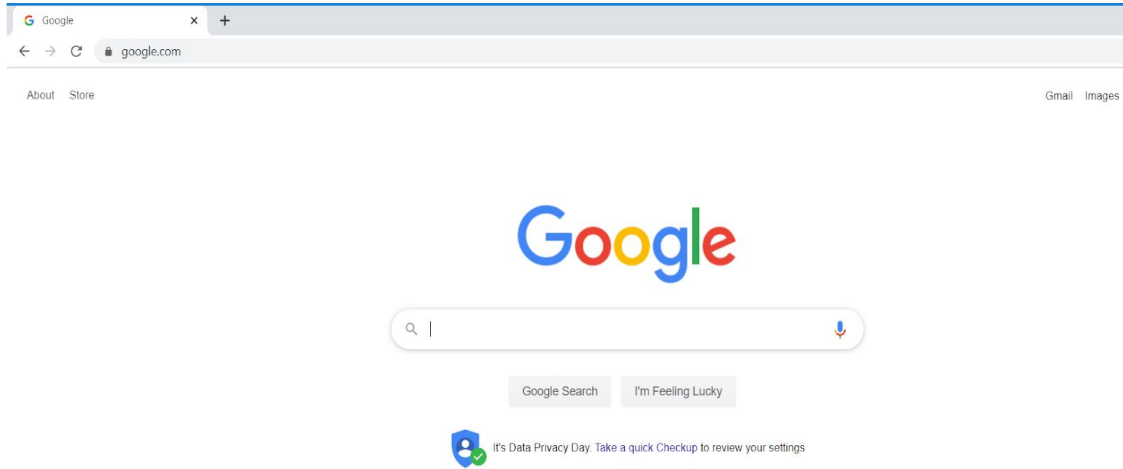


We open one of the selected web browsers and enter Google.com in the address bar - one of the largest and most popular search engines. Then - just click Enter key





The Google search page will appear. Enter the search term in the field under Google caption and marked with a magnifying glass on the left. Then click Enter key.

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Yes, thanks to the internet search engine we can check almost everything that comes to our minds wherever we are. Dangerous, prohibited, offending content that harms personal dignity, very private personal data, etc. are promptly removed from the internet.

Yes, there are special units that, for now, consist of real people! Those people read, check, search and delete such content.



## Basics of searching for information on the internet - how?

### Google it!



Web browser - from now on we will speak Google. It's a simplification and everyone will understand you. But remember that there are other browsers, for example Bing. But definitely Google is the largest and most popular. So popular that a word was created from it - *google it* means - look for it in your browser. Yes, in Google you can search for text, but also images, video, music, tv news, radio and then play it back.

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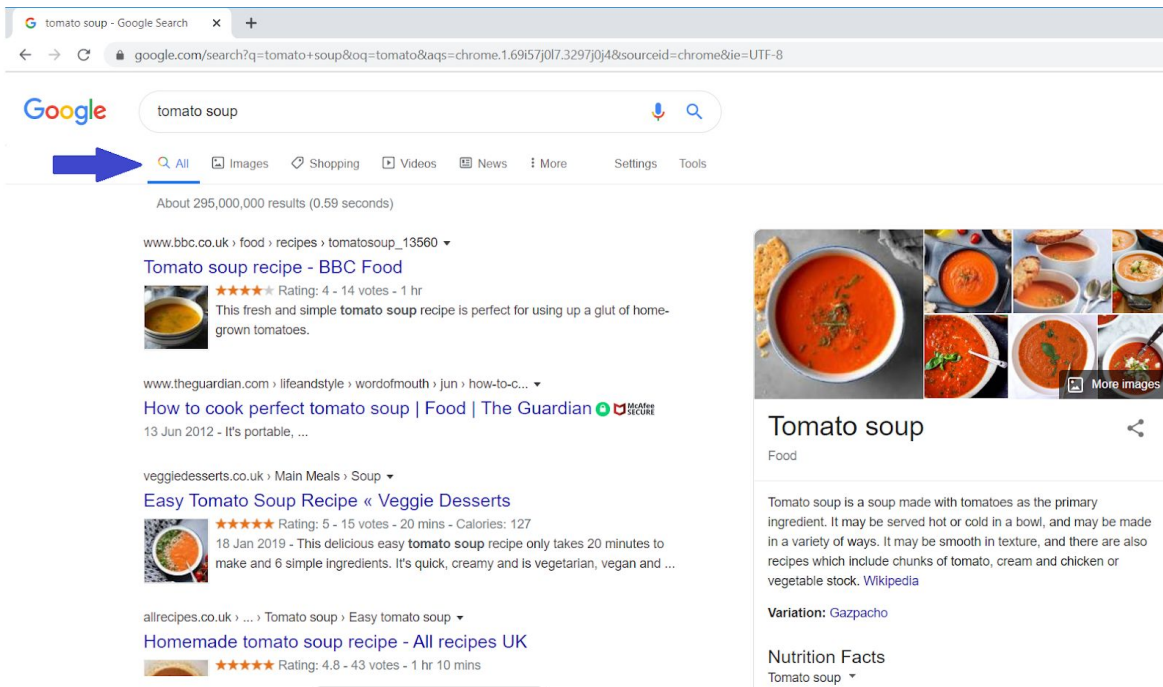
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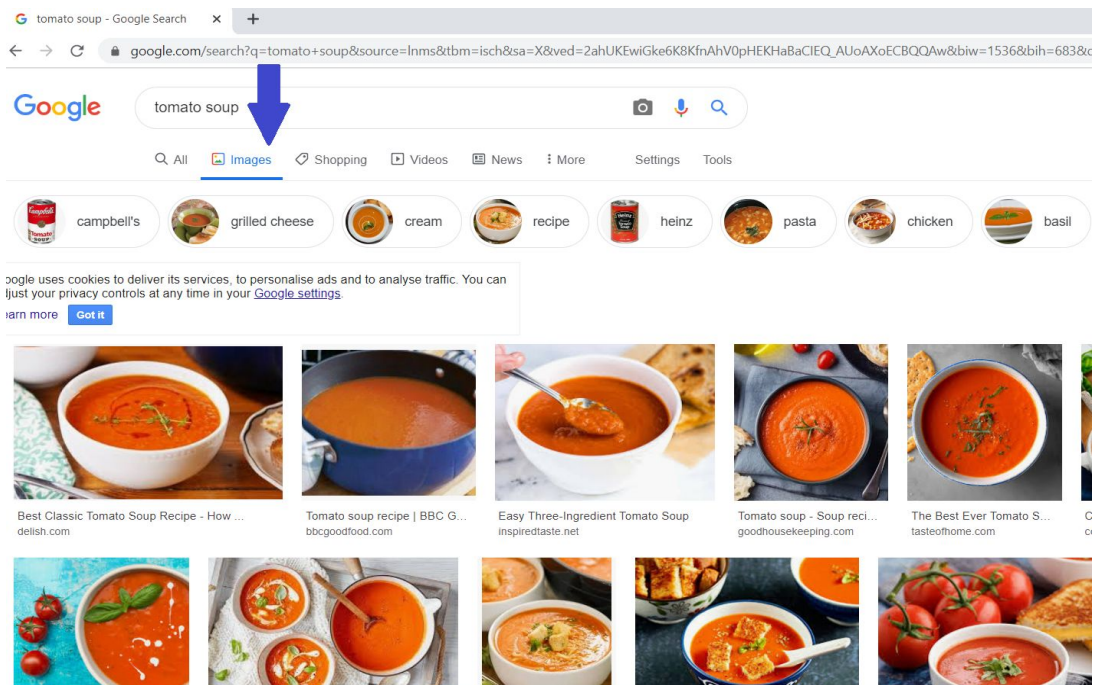
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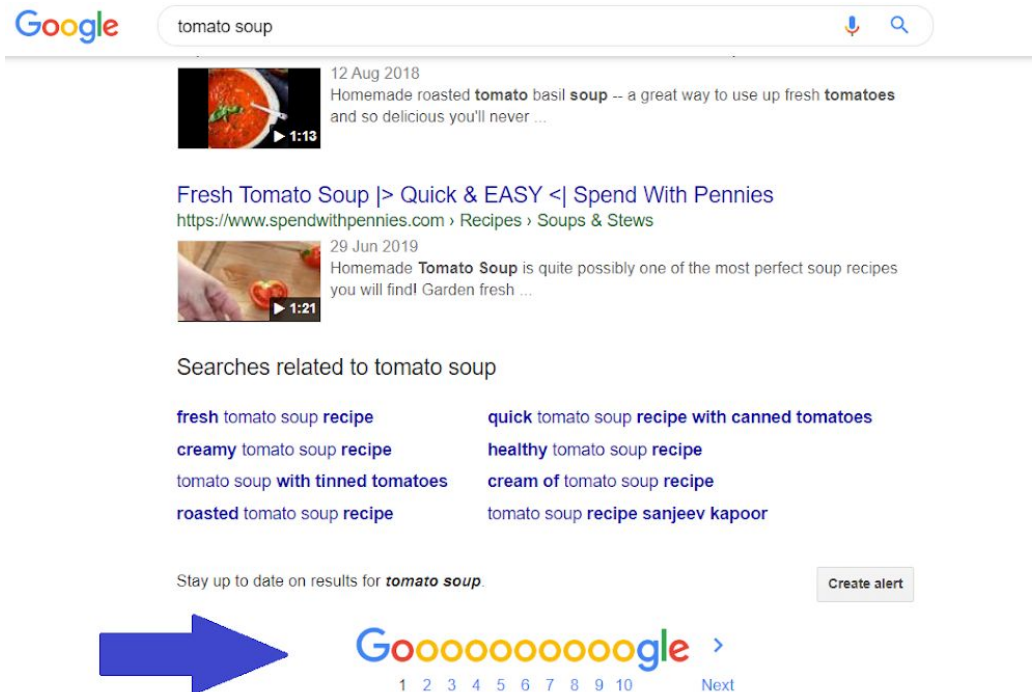
As already mentioned - everything can be found on the Internet. Almost everything. But surely you can find various things, e.g. text. The text information is searched and shown first in the browser.



By clicking on the button next to "images" we will display images, photos, drawings of the given word.



Search results can be very large, e.g. for our word "tomato soup" more than 6 million results were found - various pages, texts, recipes, photos, etc. At the bottom of the page you can go to the next page with results for our search.



## IMPORTANT

You can limit the number of results found. By using operators, you can reduce the number of search results so that you get the desired result faster:

- + searches pages on the WWW that contain both terms (space before the +, no space after the +)
- - searches pages on the WWW that do not contain the term with the minus (space before -, no space after -)
- "... .." searches for related terms

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### **What else should be considered when searching the web?**

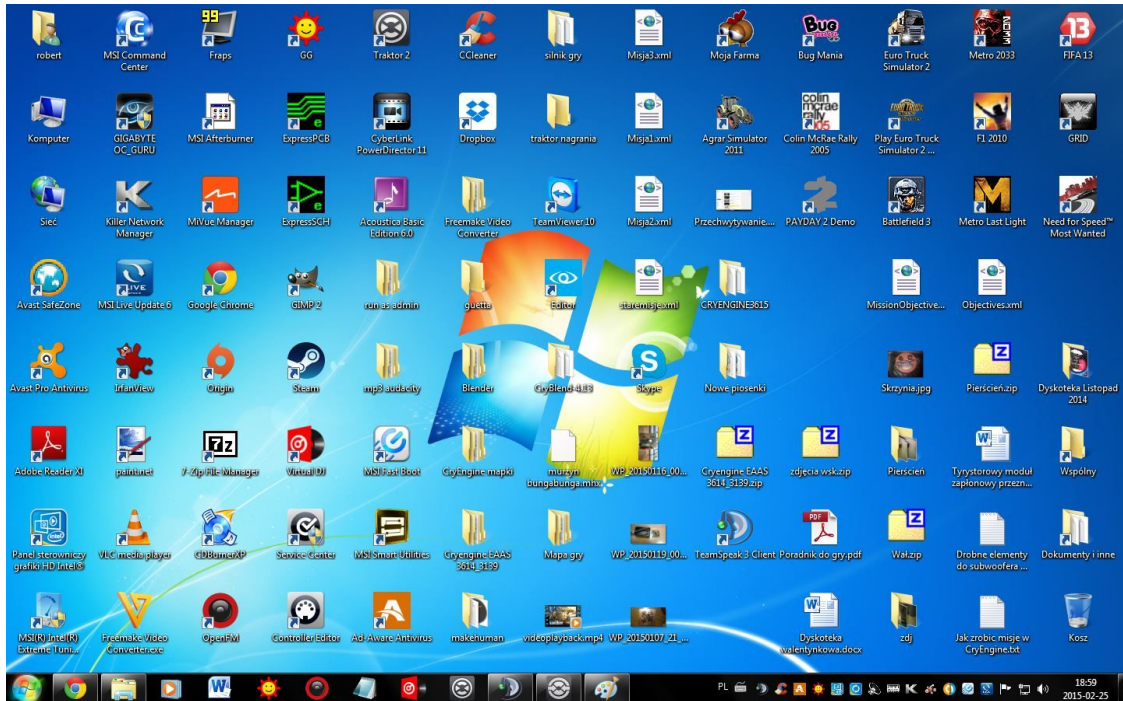
Despite the fact that there are internet cleaners and people who remove some content (previously mentioned) there is no central authority that decides where someone can publish something. That means:

- Everyone can present. It can not only be serious and true content, but also dubious or lied.
- Somebody don't delete or update their pages. Often you find outdated material, sometimes the date of the last change is not recognizable.
- The text on webpage can be sponsored, it can be an advertisement.



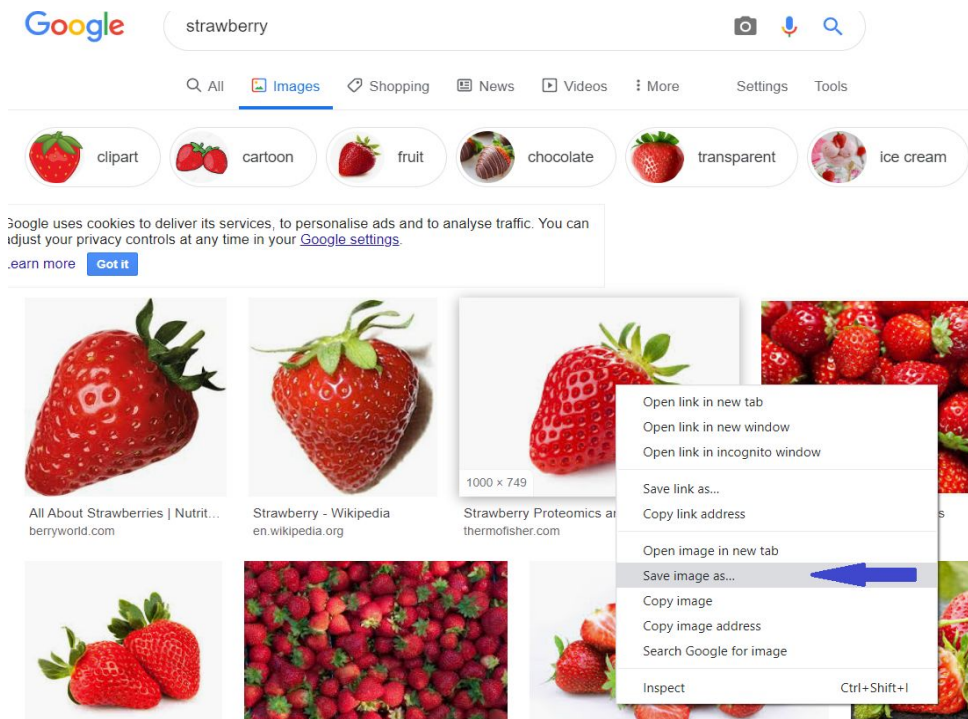
## How do you search for information and save it to your computer?

To avoid clutter on the monitor desktop, some rules must be followed.

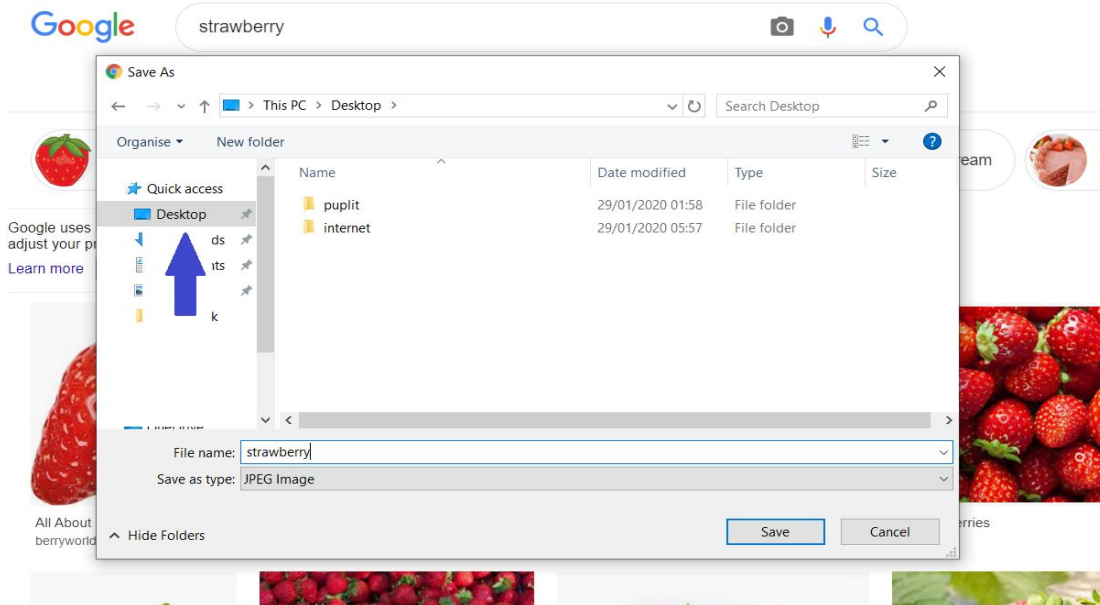


Create a new folder on your computer desktop, e.g. 'internet'.

After searching for our word, to save the image, right click on it. From the menu, select the command 'save as' or 'save image as'.

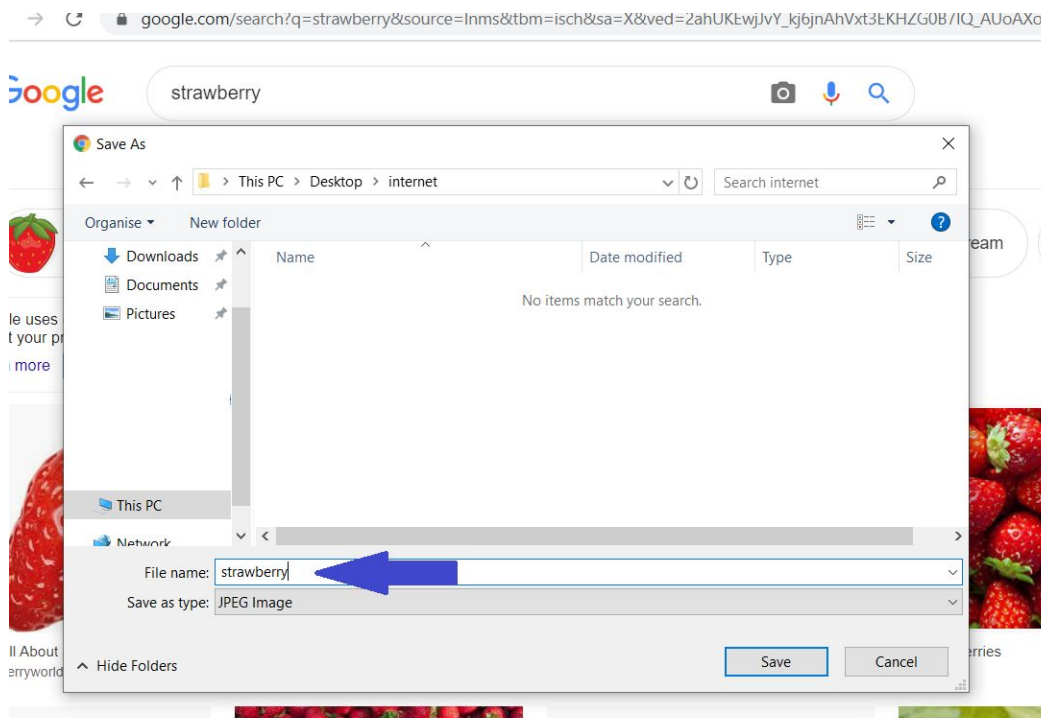


In the newly opened window, select the 'desktop' option on the left.



Now select our previously created 'internet' folder. Click on it twice.

In the field below (marked with an arrow) change the name of the saved image. It can be any name. We do this because sometimes things downloaded from the Internet may have the same name. There cannot be two things with the same name in one folder.



## Info overload & Key words - what is it?

The largest search engines claim to have indexed (saved) hundreds of billions or even billions of websites. It would take billions of A4 pages to print out this enormous amount. This would result in a stack of paper several hundred thousand kilometers high. And this pile grows many kilometers every day. How do I find the sheet that contains the information I am looking for?



However, you will quickly notice how difficult it is to find not only any hits, but also matching hits. A search engine always gives you a hit if it exactly matches the combination of letters or digits (a character string) you are looking for, which is located at any point on a website that is stored in the search engine's database.

But even if search engines such as Google do a lot of thinking for us and already deliver surprisingly good results with just a few search terms, you should be familiar with the basic search options to make the search successful

Keyword research is a search engine **optimization technique** used to identify search terms that people type in to locate information for a given topic. This can be done through a variety of different methods.

Ask yourself which key terms are important for your search and combine them with each other. If you are looking for maths, for example, you could add the terms “high school”, “teaching material” or similar to your search to narrow the search results.

**Or**

You want to spend your next vacation in a holiday home in Sicily. If you simply enter "I am looking for a holiday home in Sicily" for a search engine, this will unfortunately not lead to the desired results, since the search engine no human intelligence. Therefore, you have to ask yourself before each search: **Which words are relevant** for the search and **how do I combine** the search terms with each other? The most important word in your question is vacation. If you simply enter the term vacation in a search engine, you will be amazed at how many hits are delivered to you. You'd think the whole internet was just holiday deals (estimate how many pages the Google search engine would find and then click this link).



**To avoid drowning** in the flood of information (or data) that is delivered to you, you have to **specify your search query**. All search engines offer different options to combine search terms with each other and thus narrow down the search query. **Ask precise questions to get precise answers.**



The best thing to do is to enter the search terms themselves in lower case letters (only then will all forms of writing be found) and always in the singular (since the words appear more often in the singular than in the plural).

**IMPORTANT - REMEMBER:**

1. Concise keywords - Full sentences are not only unnecessary typing, but also offer no additional profit in the results.
2. Specify your search - enter more than one word, e.g. holidays Sicily.
3. Don't ask questions. If you want to know the weather tomorrow, enter - weather Tuesday.
4. Use quotation marks if you're searching for a specific quote, e.g. "He stepped down, trying not to look long at her".
5. Use lower case letter.

The Internet is a great world. We can find everything on it. The Internet can help us when looking for specific information, to solve everyday issues. The Internet can also bring entertainment to our homes. The Internet is all around us and becomes part of our lives.

## Introduction to Online Security – the main things about Online Security

Everything seems absolutely simple. We take our device, connect it to the Internet, take a credit card, and start shopping. We need to buy something... but the goods will be sold out soon!

We often act quickly, but we are not thinking about the consequences anymore. The Internet can help us, but it can also be very dangerous for inexperienced users. Important information may be stolen in a moment. It is important to be prepared for life on the Internet. Internet security is the cornerstone of Internet life.

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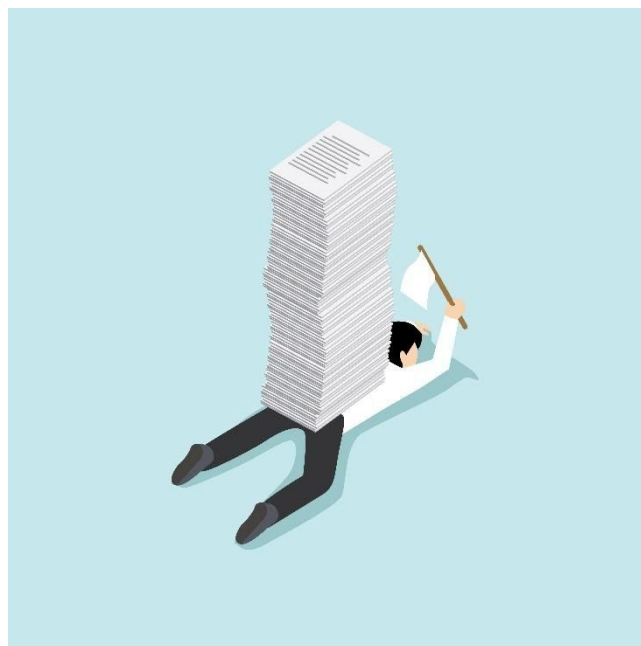
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**It is not easy to be prepared, but it is important to be at least informed about the most significant points leading to safe movement on the Internet.** The issue of security on the Internet is difficult even for experts. A beginner may be confused or frightened. It is essential that every user tries to get acquainted with the main elements of Internet security. **It is a never-ending process.**





**IMPORTANT:**

Invest money and your time in the security of your computers and try to keep them safe and in good condition! If you do not understand the issue of security on the Internet, look for experts who will help you with the initial setup and regular maintenance!



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## Web Browsing

Browse the web with a web browser and find interesting information. Sending and receiving emails. These are the basic possibilities that the Internet offers us.

Hackers and virus makers can infect the computer if the user set low security level in the e-mail application and web browser. They can do this by sending a malicious e-mail or by tempting to visit a malicious site.

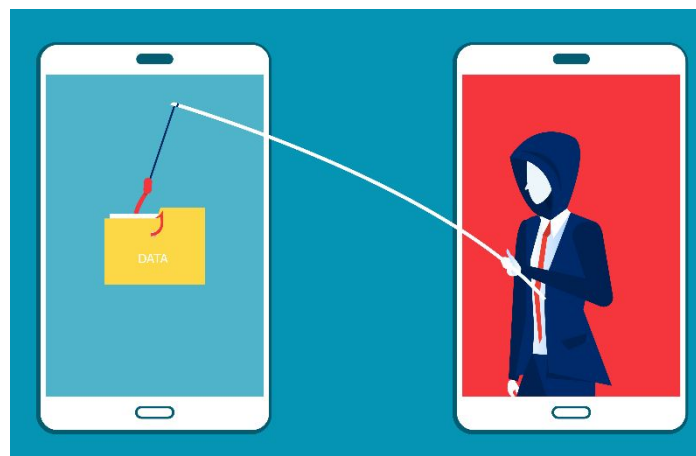

**Phishing** is a deceptive act to lure your personal information such as credit card numbers, passwords, and other important information. It can also be described as identity theft or as a type of social engineering.

**We can encounter scams of this type:**

- in the Emails that appear to be from our colleague or anyone we know well
- on our social networking website
- on various fake websites that donate donations to charities
- on a website that we feel familiar, but has a slightly different web address, so it is hard to notice
- during our communicating on the Internet
- on our mobile device





**Fraudulent information often relies on links in emails, websites, or chat that seem to come from a service you trust, such as your bank, credit card provider, or your social network. The goal of social engineering is usually to silently install spyware or confuse you to reveal your passwords or other financial or personal information. Never respond to unsolicited prompts to update your account information!**

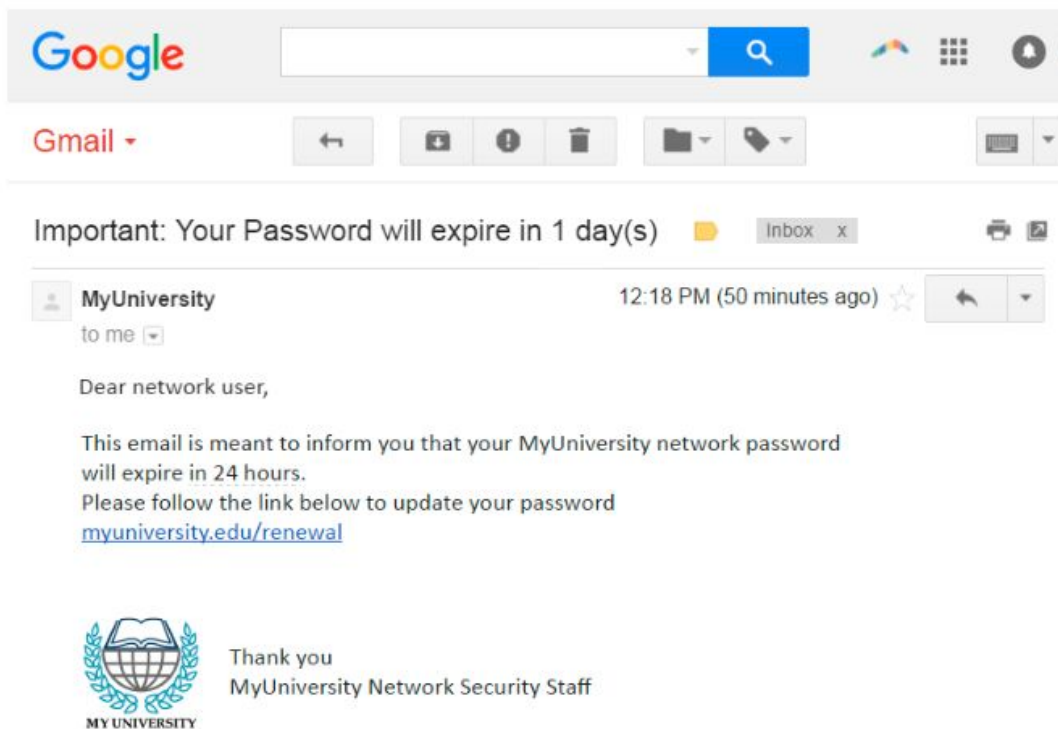

As you can see from the picture, there was created a page that was supposed to look the same as the official Facebook login page. If the user is inattentive, his or her login information will be lured out and his or her identity may be misused or stolen.

**Spoofing** is a type of cybercrime involves using fraudulent information and trying to convince a person that he is on the right website and get him to reveal his personal information, such as a credit card number. **Fake Website = Spoofing**

### How can we protect ourselves?

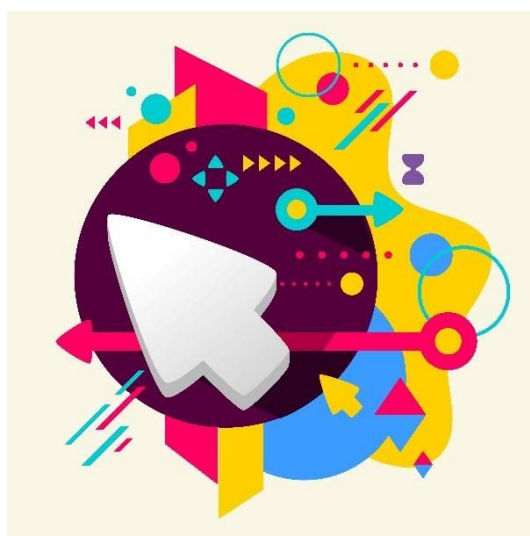
Keep your firewall on.

Always keep your software and operating system up to date.

Do not click without thinking on all links.



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## Online communication

The Internet has made communication easier for the world. Online communication is used by all Internet users. The transmission of any information to the addressee has been minimized. We are mostly unable to follow any further fate of the information we send. Facilitating communication over the Internet brings with it risks and we have to think about it. Prudence in sending more sensitive content, such as personal data or private materials, is therefore right.

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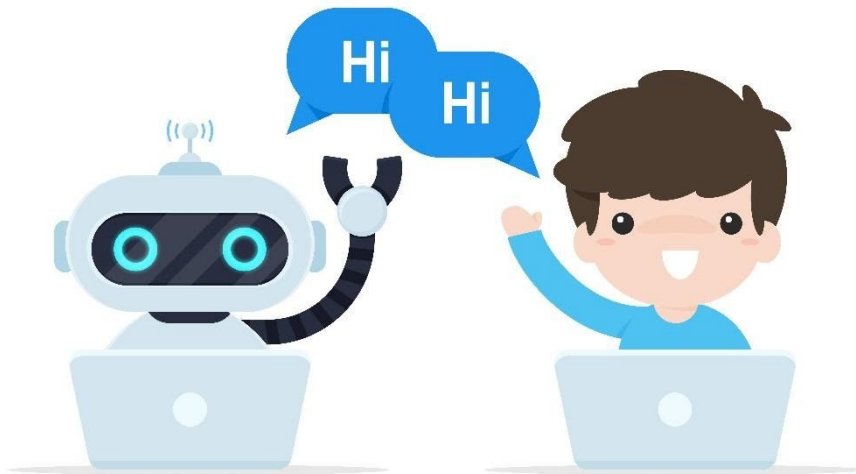

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**IMPORTANT:**

Online communication on the Internet is very popular. Previously, sending the email was among the fastest communication. Now we can communicate in real time. The only delay is due to keyboard control practice or the speed of our speaking. We can use tools like Skype, WhatsApp, Messenger and other.

**The biggest risk we take on the Internet is the loss of privacy. Be aware that what we post on the Internet can usually be undone and deleted. Personal information and passwords may be stolen.**

**Don't trust every piece of information you get online. Protect your privacy!**

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## E-mail

The main communication channel is the e-mail on the Internet. Through e-mail, we communicate privately and at work. Email is used to send and receive e-mail. Its usual part has become an attachment. By e-mail, it is possible to send a set of smaller data dimensions, such as documents, without any problems. Some risks are associated with the mailbox. Some are just annoying, such as spam. However, some unsolicited mail is intended to get personal data or even login data from you. Here too, it is necessary to beware and pay attention to the potential risks that are related to the Internet environment, namely by e-mail.

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**IMPORTANT:**

Spam is junk e-mail, an e-mail sent to a huge number of mailboxes. It is not a targeted advertisement for a selected group of people, but a mass distribution of a given message (advertisement) to anyone. Another common feature of spam is that the sender's address is spoofed. It is replaced by a non-existent sender or replaced by the recipient's email.

**SPAM may include a dangerous attachment. Never download or open an attachment when it is an untrusted message.**

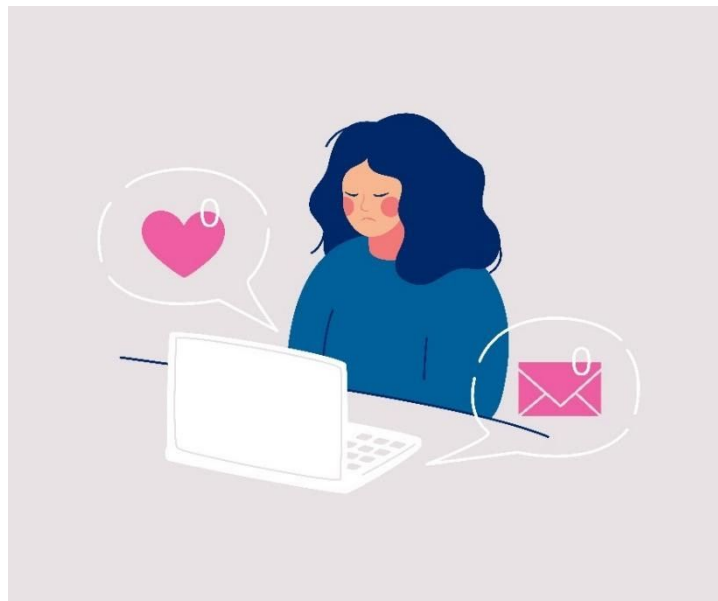
**Using antivirus and firewall helps us to evaluate SPAM, move spam and unsafe messages to SPAM folder.**



## Social networks

Social networks allow you to share experiences with your friends, but also with strangers who you allow. There are many thematic networks - designed to familiarize, search for and maintain relationships between classmates or acquaintances, minority networks or some form of expert group. Different social networks also have different rules and habits.

Therefore, we cannot expect for different networks to have identical rules for their safe use. However, we would find some common safety recommendations that apply to all networks without exception. They concern the careful sharing of private content or personal information.

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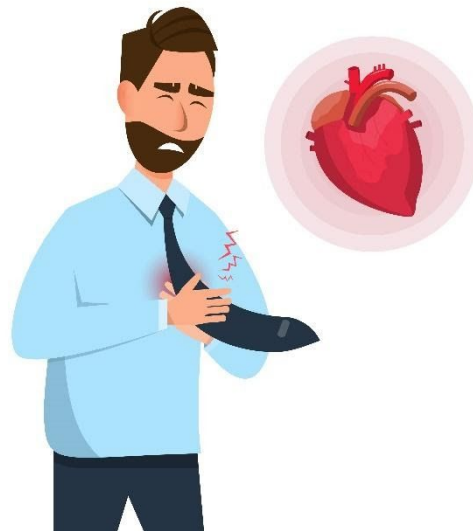

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**IMPORTANT:**

One of the most widespread social networks at the moment is Facebook. It is used to connect between known and unknown people. Risk is associated with an uncontrollable need for presence on this and other social networks. People spend their time connecting to

the Internet and communicating with strangers on the other side. Risk is associated with loss of identity, disclosure of private information, often communication with someone who created identity according to our requirements. This person tries to be our friend, but often tries to abuse our privacy and information.

**Let's not share our privacy with an unknown person!**



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## Passwords

Passwords are keys that are used to access different types of accounts, whether on a computer, corporate network or services, businesses, and other online portals. If these data are stolen by criminals or other malicious users, they can access accounts and cause considerable damage.

These include, for example, obtaining computer control, transferring money from a bank account, making online payments on behalf of the account owner, stealing identity, and misusing it for various types of crime.

These cases are often detected when it is too late. Fortunately, it is not difficult to create a complex password and protect personal data.

**IMPORTANT:**

People don't like passwords. They must remember them all, they must remember a large number of passwords. They try to use simple passwords, constantly repeating passwords. When their account is misused, they are surprised and do not understand what happened.

We must be able to use the computer keyboard to create a strong password. The password must contain special characters, and when the user is unable to use the keyboard, it is difficult to use those characters.

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## Computer security/Data protection/Download files and programs

Just as we protect our homes with doors and locks, it is necessary to protect our computer and the data stored in it. Underestimating the security of our computer may result in the loss of sensitive data, the loss of usernames and passwords, and their subsequent misuse of illegal enrichment or committing crime on our behalf.

Data in the computer are the most valuable. Lost or damaged family photos, videos or work stored in different types of documents cannot be replaced. It is therefore good to keep in mind data protection in several areas. The first area is to back up data because even hard drives of computers can be damaged. The other area is sensitive data encryption or data encryption on computers shared by multiple users. The third area is data sharing policies, especially their sharing on the Internet.

Downloading files and programs from the Internet is one of the frequent activities on the computer. However, downloaded files may contain unwanted code that infects your computer. Therefore, it is good to follow several guidelines that will reduce the risk of infecting a computer or eliminate it altogether.



When working with a public computer in a library, an Internet café, or at an airport, care must be taken. Also, the connection to the public wireless network is associated with security risks. Learn the rules that make your actions safer. We must also not forget to secure your home wireless network.

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**IMPORTANT:**

Computers (and all other devices) that are freely available and shared are not suitable for private use. There is a high risk of data leakage and misuse (passwords, credentials, credit card numbers, etc.). These same risks are associated with a free internet connection (WIFI and LAN connection), even if we use our private device.

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## Shopping over the Internet

Online shopping is becoming more and more popular. We are attracted by lower prices of almost all kinds of goods compared to the purchase in the store and the possibility of quickly comparing the goods and obtaining information about these goods on the store pages. Time saving and the ability to shop at any time of day or night is also of considerable significance. The risks associated with online payments can discourage us. By adhering to the security principles, we can minimize all the risks.



### Other modules are involved in online shopping.

Let us review only important rules:

- check the credibility of online shops (store reviews, discussion forums, etc.)
- keep your device secure and updated
- use an antivirus and a firewall
- check your Internet connection security
- do not enter private information into a store that is not trusted to you
- read the terms and conditions before ordering



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## Internet banking

Internet banking allows us to conduct banking operations from any computer connected to the Internet 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Internet banking now offers almost the same features as the usual bank branch. Typical Internet banking features include ordering payment, direct debiting, tracking of accounts, as well as investing in various financial products. For secure Internet banking, a few basic rules are required.

- take care of your device that you use for Internet banking (use antivirus, enabled firewall, enabled automatic updates)



- learn about security risks when using a credit card on the Internet
- check your Internet connection security
- protect your private information
- always check and read everything thoroughly
- check your bank's terms and conditions

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# Online booking

## Introduction

The internet offers lots of opportunities to make our lives easier. One of which is booking tickets for events, flights or arranging travelling to other places. We will show you and teach how you can benefit from the services on the internet. If you have not tried to use the internet before for such purpose it might seem scaring and risky to use your data online. In this module we will explore precautions you need to take to keep safe and enjoy booking services from the comfort of your home.

The purpose of the module is to encourage people to use actively the computer in their daily lives and use available services such as booking online.

When learning you will get acquainted with various types booking services provided on the internet. You will explore search engines which help to find and compare the service providers and services they offer. What is more, you will learn about the means of data provision while booking something and safety rules when providing personal data. The potential consequences of personal data transfer online will be explained to you as well. Finally, you will be able to plan your holiday: book a flight, a hotel, arrange your excursions and transfers from the comfort of your home.

### We will focus on the following steps:

- **Basics of online booking**
- **Test use of an online booking service provider (flight ticket, hotel room)**
- **Learning to identify a safe online booking**

## Basics of online booking

The internet or World Wide Web is not organized, edited, or controlled by anyone – it consists of billions of websites created by individuals, companies, and organizations.

Websites are made up of web pages which contain information in the form of text, images, and audio and video material.

Websites can provide information or entertainment, sell a product, or promote a service.

A browser which is installed on your computer lets you view websites on the internet. Every website has an address - sometimes it is called a web address, URL, or a domain name. The best way to access a specific website is to tell your browser to go directly to the website's address. But if you do not know the address you can find it using search engines to find the information you need. Most popular is GOOGLE.

All the websites providing booking service have main elements in common. Let's examine the website [www.booking.com](http://www.booking.com) which provides hotel booking

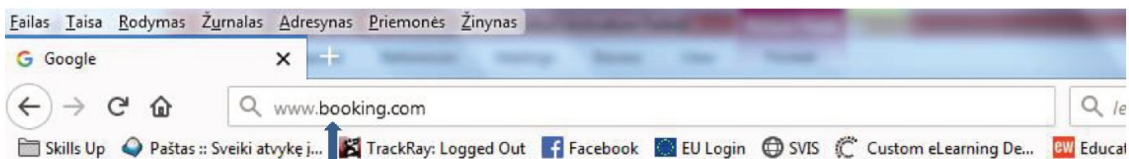

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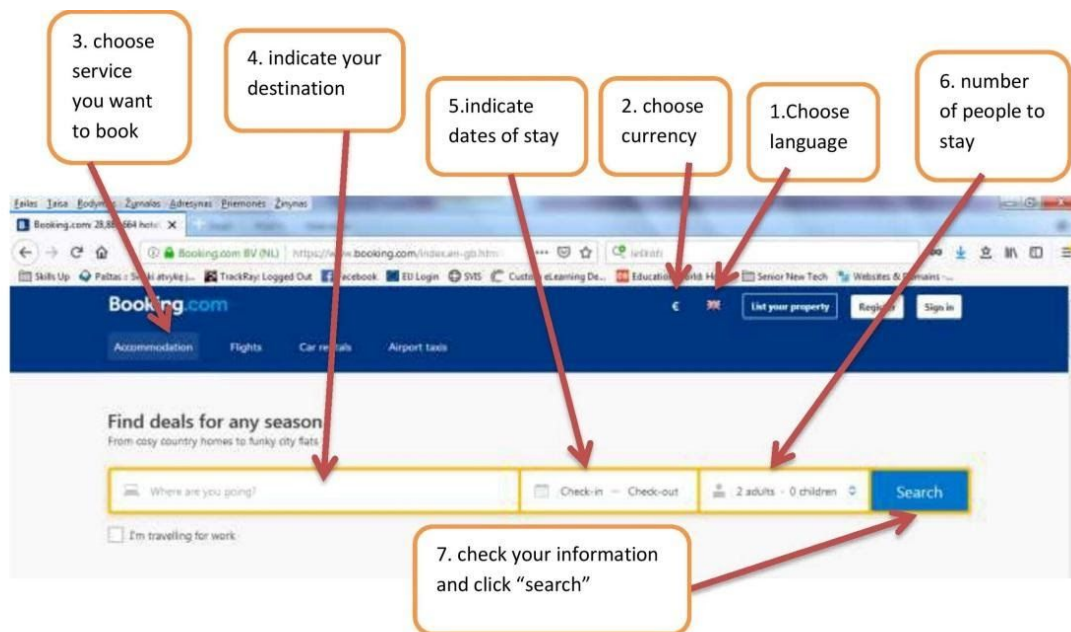

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# Online Shopping

## Introduction

The aim of this module is to learn online shopping, namely what it is and its basic concepts, and what constitutes as safe online browsing and shopping.

Knowing how online shopping works is very valuable nowadays since a great proportion of the shopping market has moved online due to cheaper operating costs and easier access to target customers. Not only shops but also banks, public transport companies etc. have moved their business online. Consequently, having knowledge about safe browsing and online shopping is crucial.

In this module you will learn how online shops operate and how to shop online in accordance with good practices of online shopping.

- **Basics of online shopping**
- **Test use of an online shop**
- **Learning to identify a safe online shop**





## Basics of online shopping

Online shopping takes place on the world wide web. The purpose is to buy certain products or services from a distant location (from home, abroad etc.) and that no physical contact is needed.

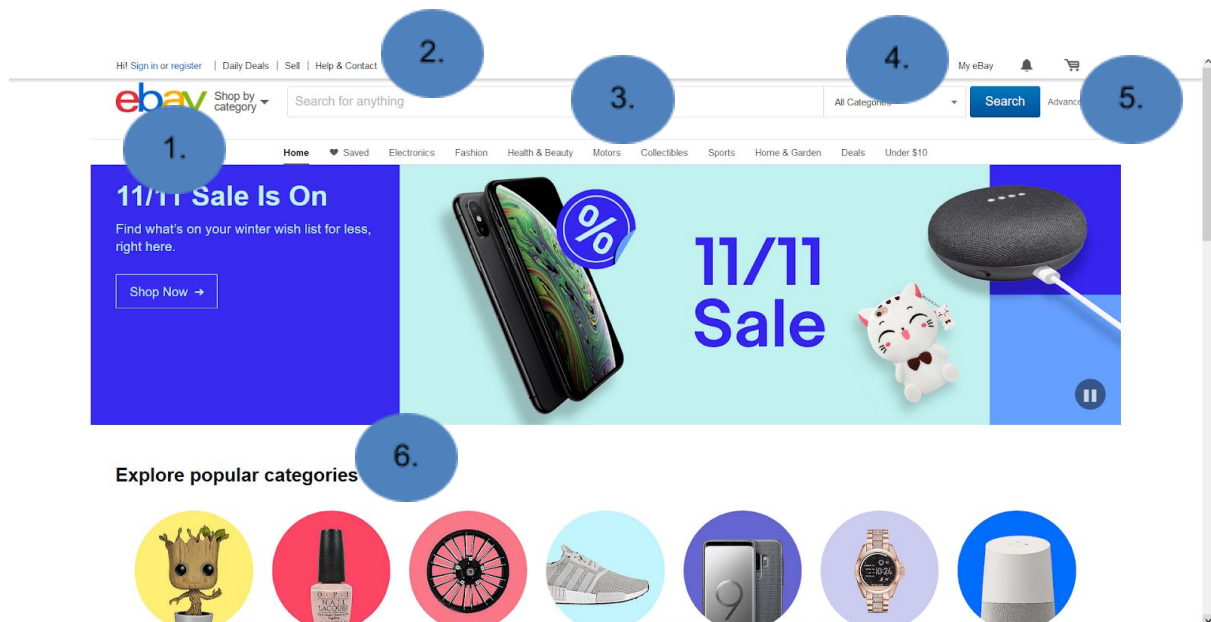
## How to access an online shop

There is a plethora of online shops in existence. We recommend to start online shopping in your country online shops as they are easier for learning and gaining experience.

Example: Type eBay in the Google search engine. eBay is a very popular global online shop which is simple to use and offers good customer support and safety.

With a few additional clicks you will open the online shop, and you will immediately notice some of the main elements of an online shop.



Those elements are:

1. A shopping department (here you can select the main categories of products available in the online shop)
2. Useful links (store locations, information about the company, contact details)
3. Search box (if you wish to gain information about a specific product)
4. My account (before shopping in an online shop one needs to create a user account with the information about the delivery address, contact details etc.)
5. Shopping cart (the basket is literally your shopping cart. When you decide to buy a certain product, click on it to move it into the basket that will take you all the way to the check out and payment)
6. Placed products – “Popular at this moment” are the products that have a special discounted price at that moment or have reached a high number of sales in the current month. In this way one can find special discounts and buy the products cheaper than somewhere else).

**IMPORTANT**

**Safety advice!** – Before you decide to shop in an online shop, always check the owner/company running the online shop. Frequently, special prices and very low prices of products and services can be a sign of a fraud. In such cases there often isn't any information about the manager of the online shop, as such websites are in operation only for a few days – but enough to take advantage of inexperienced users)

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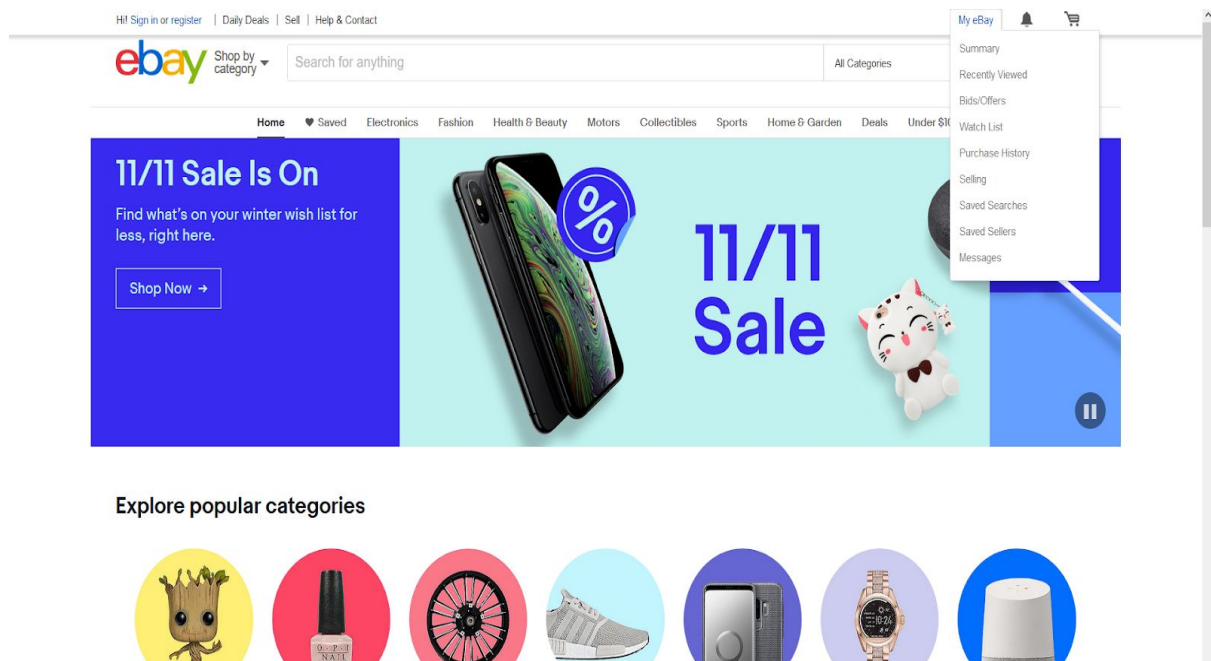

Online shops are very much alike due to certain rules in design and user experience. This means that knowing how to use one online shop makes it easier to use others. Thus, it is important to learn on an example of a relatively large, but foremost safe online shop (such as ebay.com).

In this part of the workbook we will create a user profile and set it up for actual use.

In the ebay.com online shop select My Ebay, which will open a new window for registration.



We select **Create a new account** and fill out the required information in the form.

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
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When we decide to buy the product, we click on **Add to cart** button. Once we click on it, a new window opens since we have not entered the delivery address yet. We complete this form only the first time.

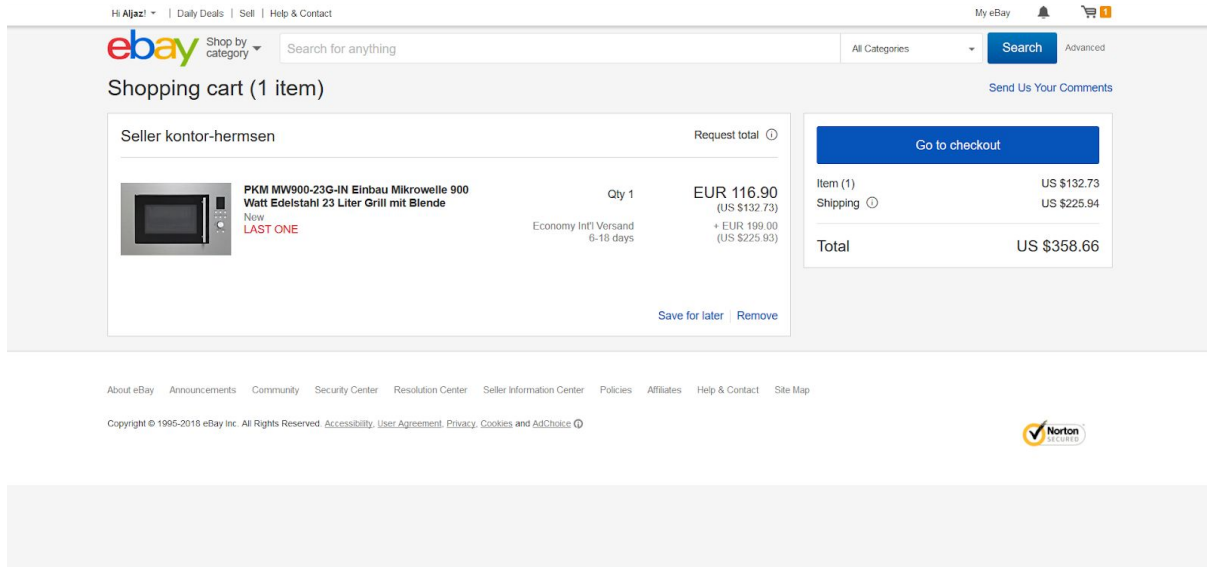

After we complete the necessary information, we click on **Go to checkout**. Even if you add a product to the cart, you can still continue shopping. That in fact is the purpose of having a cart.

**Task number two:**

When you select Go to checkout, a few steps are needed: check the cart, registration (if you haven't registered yet), confirmation of the payee's address and the delivery address; delivery method and payment method, and the confirmation of the order.

To practice – complete the steps together with your lecturer and write down all the questions you might have. Stop at payment methods.

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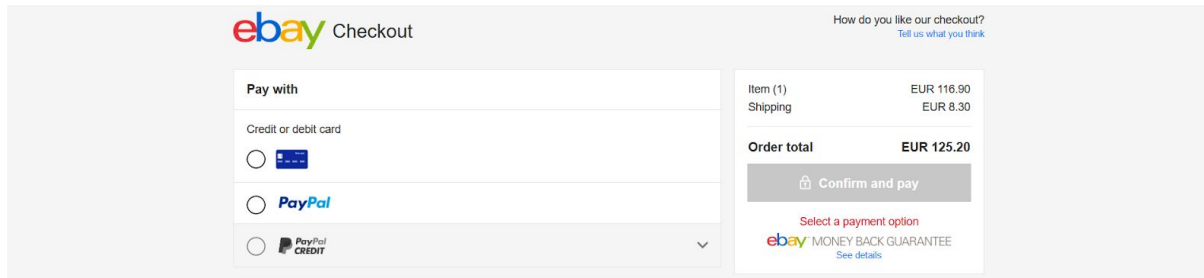
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## Payment methods



Payment methods depend on the size and the market of an online shop. Often the following payment methods are available:

- Cash on delivery (paid to the postman)
- Credit card payment (using this method requires the user to be **the most careful**)
- Using VISA or PayPal
- Direct debit, Pro forma invoice (bank account payment) – the safest way of payment for inexperienced users.

Regardless of which payment method one selects, always check the amount and the address of the payer; and be careful when making the payment (check all the boxes in the form etc.).

Since we are using this online shop for demonstration purposes only, we will not complete the order. There is however only one last step needed to complete the order – namely to check all the information and make the final confirmation of the order.

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### Identification of a safe online shop

Fake online shops are just fronts with beautiful pictures but there isn't a legitimate company behind this presentation. Making a purchase in such a shop is a great risk as the buyer will not only not receive the ordered goods, but his or her credit card details can be stolen and misused; or the buyer buys a fake product that will be seized and destroyed at the customs. Most common fake online shops sell products of popular brands such as iPhone, iPad, Ugg, photo equipment etc.

### IMPORTANT

How to find out if the online shop is fake or if the seller cannot be trusted?





- **An incredibly good offer.** The first sign of a possible fraud is an unbelievable price. When an offer significantly differs from similar products in presentation, price or characteristics, this is a definite reason for concern. It is also important how you got to this shop. Where did you find out about it? Did you click on an add on a website or in an email? There is less risk involved if you find out about an offer from the television or if you type the web address yourself. The rule of thumb is: if a stranger gets in contact with you via email, Facebook or a chat software (such as Skype) and offers web links, don't trust them!
  
- **Good news spread fast, bad news even faster.** Find reviews of other customers or users, find out about their experience, evaluations and comments. Check the shop by doing a browser search, and check forums for negative comments from the buyers with bad experience.
  
- **Check** who is behind the online shop. Check the contact information of the company (address, online support phone number, email). Get in contact with the seller and exchange a few messages. Does the email match the online shop address? If the seller is using a free email account (gmail.com, hotmail.com, live.com itd.) it is an additional sign that this could be a fraud.
  
- **Payment methods**  
When the seller wants the payment via Western Union or MoneyGram this is a major reason for concern. Such payment methods are meant for a quick transfer of money to individuals, tracking is not possible and because of this they are a popular method used by frauds.

For more information about general safety on the world wide web we recommend checking different web pages. On the basis of your research you can compare the findings and learn something new. And this is the best approach to avoid online frauds – using knowledge.



# Social networks

## Introduction

The purpose of this module is for the participants to learn about social networks, how they work, and which social networks exist on the web; in particular, the participants will learn about Facebook.

The research conducted as part of the Pew Internet and American Life project, found that the number of people older than 50 that use online social networks has doubled in the last 5 years. The main reasons for the use of social networks are reconnecting with people, blogging, taking part in online discussions, building intergenerational bridges (connecting with the youth) and playing games.

Why are we focusing on Facebook? Mostly because the majority of people that have access to a computer and the internet have a Facebook account. Because of this Facebook is the best place for find people that we know, or to find like-minded people in interest groups.

### We will focus on the following steps:

- **basics of social networks**
- **Creating a user profile**
- **Safe use of on social networks**



## Basics of social networks

When most people hear the expression social networks, they first think of online social networks. This is because the popularity of online social networks has grown rapidly in recent years – they have become a part of our everyday life. Facebook, YouTube, Instagram, Twitter and LinkedIn are in the top 15 most visited websites in the world.

The most basic characteristic of social networks is the option of creating and sharing a personal profile. The profile page usually includes a photo, some basic personal data (name, age, gender, location) and an additional space to list favourite groups, books, TV shows, films, hobbies and websites. The majority of social networks also offer the option to publish photos, music, videos and personal blogs on your profile.

The most important characteristic of social networks is the option to search other members of the network and establish social connections with them. These »friends« are shown as links on the page of your profile, meaning that visitors can easily browse their network of friends.

### **Different types of social networks**

There are many different social networks on the web. However, only few of them have become very popular among the users of the world wide web. Social networks can be divided in the following types:

Focus on photos: Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr

Focus on videos: YouTube, Vimeo

Focus on business connections: LinkedIn

Mixes: Facebook, Twitter

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
### Creating a user profile



Just as online shops, social networks are very similar due to certain rules of design and user experience.


In this section of the workbook, you will learn how to create your user profile and prepare it for the actual use of a social network.

In a web browser, we type Facebook and open the website facebook.com.

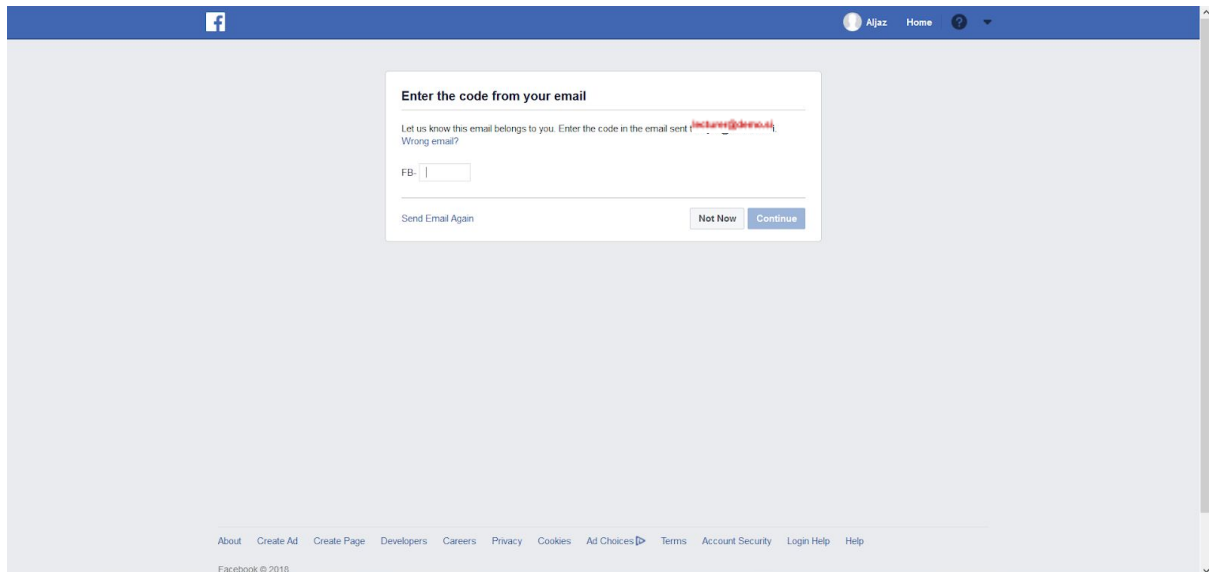

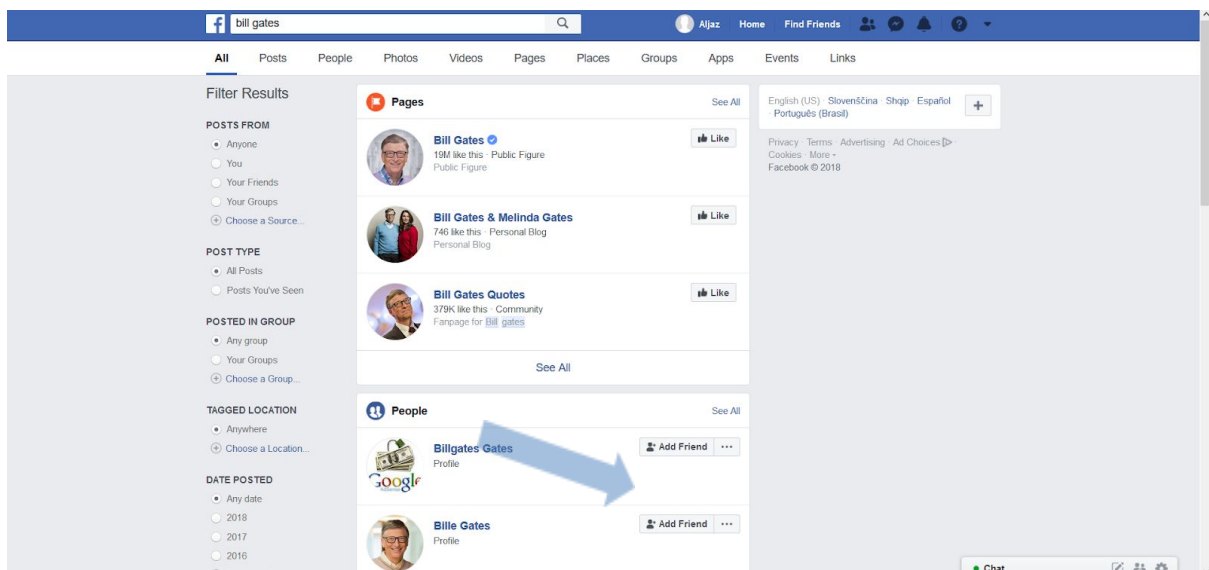
## Confirming the activation code.

Once you register on Facebook, you will receive a confirmation code to your email address (or to your phone if you provided a phone number). You copy and paste the confirmation code into the form that is shown below.



When you confirm the user account, a new window will open, enabling you to edit your user profile.

To practice, set up a user profile, check settings (language, security, etc.) and exchange friendship requests with the other participants.





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Once you set up your user profile and add a few friends, the fun can start. Firstly, we will look at all the main icons at the top of the website.



1. A click on the first icon from the left (Facebook) takes us to the home page and timeline.
2. The second element in the header is a search window, which enable us to search virtually anything that exists on Facebook.
3. A photo/element with your name is a link to your user profile. A click on the button opens a timeline, similar to the one on the home page; however, this timeline shows our posts and photos.
4. A click on the Home link produces the same results as a click on the Facebook icon – it takes us to the home page.
5. Icons:
  - i) A silhouette of two persons. Usually in dark blue colour – becomes bright only when somebody sends us a friendship invitation or when somebody accepts our friendship invitation.
  - ii) Chat cloud – also usually in dark blue colour; becomes brights only when we receive new messages.
  - iii) Earth – similar dark/bright characteristics to the previous two icons. It alerts us to different activities of Facebook (e.g. somebody tagged us on a photo, invited us to an event etc.)
  - iv) ? – this icon opens us the Help centre
  - v) Reversed triangle – open several options in a dropdown menu. Usually we use it to access Settings.

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### Safe use of social networks

Most users of social networks are not aware of the importance of safety and the dangers of inappropriate or disparaging posts (e.g. photos from parties, hate speech etc.). If you do not take the necessary steps to protect your profile, you will make it possible to everybody – not only your friends, but also total strangers – to have access to your life, thus exposing yourself to potential abuse.



There are simple steps to efficiently protect yourself against potentially unpleasant experience. This can be achieved by knowing the basics of safe use of the world wide web.

Few tips on the safe use of Facebook:

1. Check posts in which you are tagged before they appear on your timeline. Every Facebook user would be shocked if seeing on their timeline a delicate photo in which someone tagged him or her, as this means that all his or her friends can see it. Fortunately, you can take action before such photos are seen by unwanted people. **(together with your lecturer, check safety options of your timeline in Settings)**

2. What is public and what is not? How do your friends and public see your profile? Do you want to open your profile, which means everybody will be able to see your timeline, or would you like to make your posts visible only to your friends? This can be set in Settings. **(together with your lecturer, check options of public/private publication of your profile)**



3. One cannot be friends with everybody. Before confirming a friendship request, make sure you know the person, or trust them. If you receive a request from a celebrity, it is not very likely that such a person would send you a friendship request so be careful with those. Also suspicious are requests from people that do not have a profile photo, personal details, or existing friends. In such cases you may be receiving a request from a so-called fake user account, which are used for online marketing or similar purposes.

4. Blocking. You can block any Facebook user, which means they will no longer be able to contact you, see your posts, or send you a friendship request. This can be done in Settings **(check this together with your lecturer )** or in their user profile. Next to the button for sending messages you will find the Block option.



5. Did you forget to log out of Facebook when accessing it at a public place (library, coffee shop etc.). The best way to prevent that is to always make sure you log out, or to open a browser with **search history turned off**. In case your forget that you can go to Settings in Facebook and terminate all sessions on other computers.



This enables us to log out of Facebook on other locations and mobile devices (**check the option of remotely logging out with your lecturer**).

6. Do you know anyone that has won a car, a phone or a vignette on Facebook? Ignore such posts as they in most cases fraudulent and you will not get any signs of approval if sharing them with others.

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# Online banking

## Introduction

Online Banking is a modern, secure and efficient way how to manage our finances via the Internet 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The main aim of this module is to know the benefits of Online banking over a personal visit to the bank, how to be prepared for Online Banking, on which devices can be used this service, how to ensure access to Online Banking, what basic functions Online Banking can offer us and how to use Online banking safely.

- **Introduction to Online banking – the main things about online banking**
- **How to use Online banking in practice - the basic functions**
- **Online banking and security**

## Introduction to Online banking – the main things about Online banking

Online banking is a service that is available anytime, anywhere.

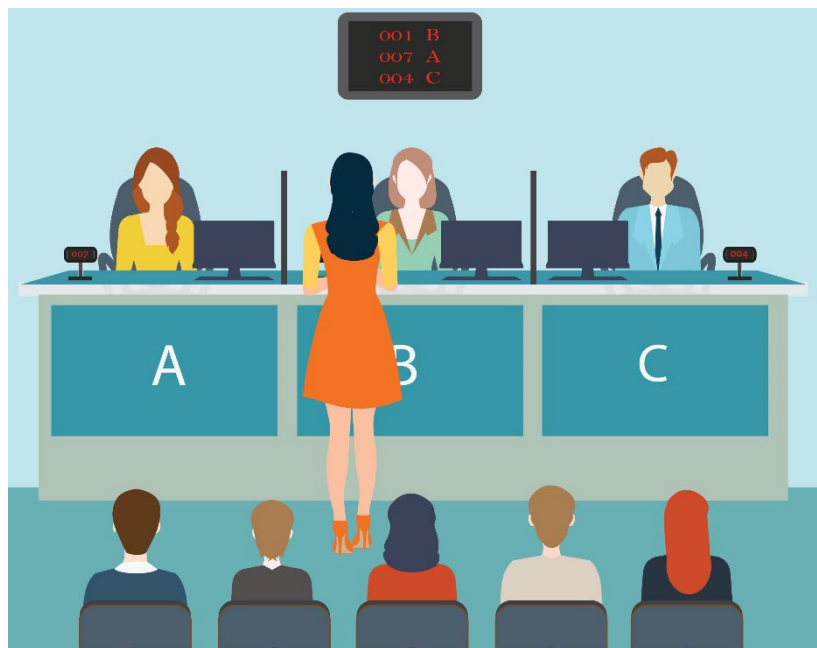
It is necessary to have an Internet connection through which the service will be accessed, a specific device that will allow us access to Online banking. Everything must be preceded by the activation of Online banking in our bank. Quite often the activation of Online banking is automatic when we open a bank account in our bank.

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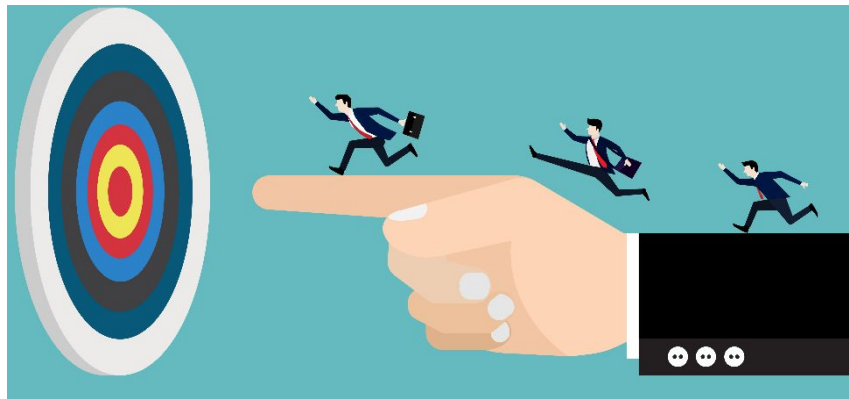

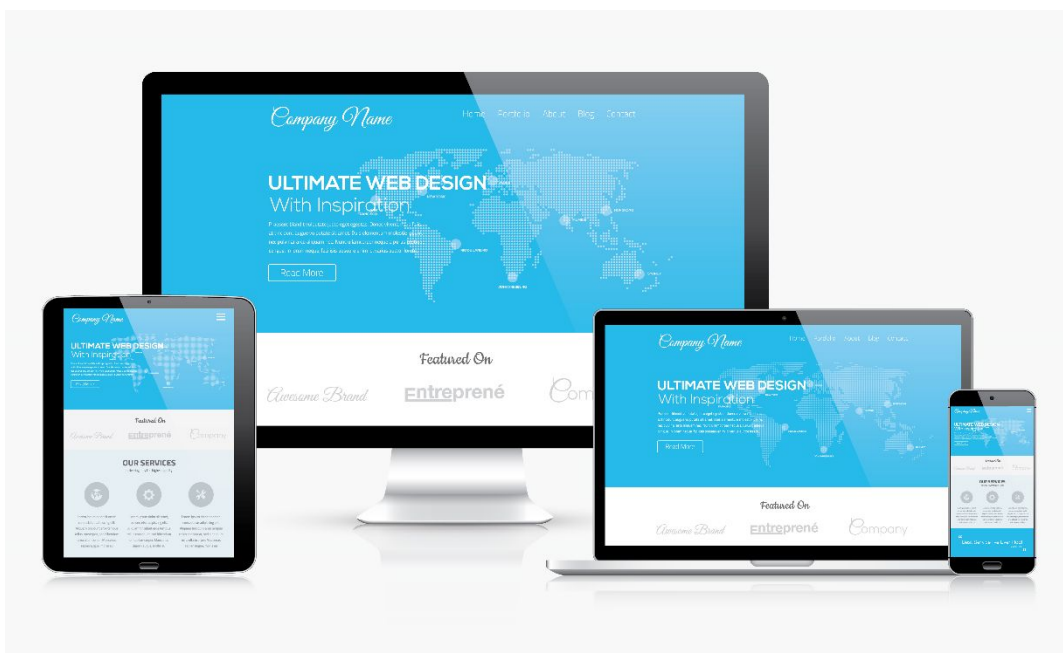

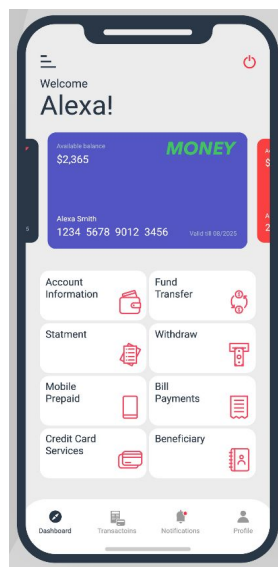
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**Thanks to the following basic devices (desktop, laptop / laptop, tablet, smartphone) we can enter the Online banking.**

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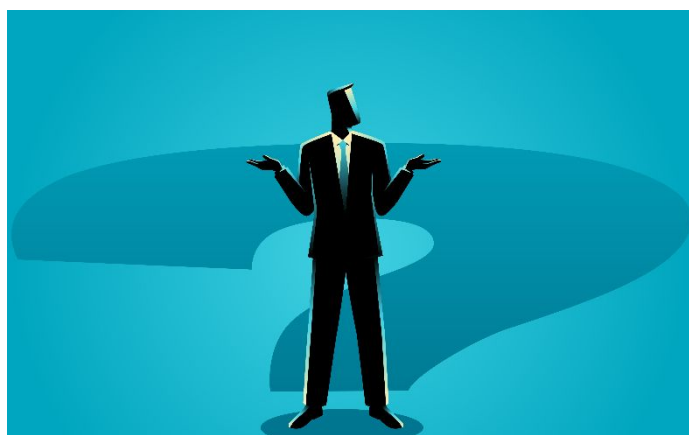
## How to use Online banking in practice - the basic functions

Online banking allows the user a wide range of options.

With a device that is connected to the Internet when properly set up according to bank conditions, we can:

- viewing account balances
- viewing recent transactions
- downloading bank statements, for example in PDF format
- download periodic account statements
- downloading applications for M-banking, E-banking etc.
- funds transfers between the customer's linked accounts
- paying third parties, including bill payments and third-party fund transfers
- investment purchase or sale
- loan applications and transactions, such as repayments of enrolments
- credit card applications
- register utility billers and make bill payments
- financial institution administration
- management of multiple users having varying levels of authority
- transaction approval process
- etc.

**Banks often do not want any fee for using Online Banking. Charges may be a certain amount linked to a specific transaction in Online banking. (We recommend that you check the current conditions / price list at your bank.)**

- o The **"Single payments"** tab, offers local payments in the country, international payments (SEPA credit transfer or Foreign payment), Multiple payment, etc.
- o We will focus mainly on **"Domestic payment"**. Here you can enter a payment order. Simply send money from your bank account to another account. We can pay an invoice for electricity, gas, pay a ticket etc.
- o It is always necessary to fill in the bank account number (where the money will be sent), the amount, eventually variable symbol / constant symbol / specific symbol, due date, message for me and message for recipient.
- o **In order to make a payment, the bank then requires some further verification.** This is important for safety. For example, it is necessary to re-enter the password for login to Online banking or the system will send us an SMS to our registered phone and then we have to copy the code from the SMS to the appropriate location in Online banking.
- o **Money is on the way!**



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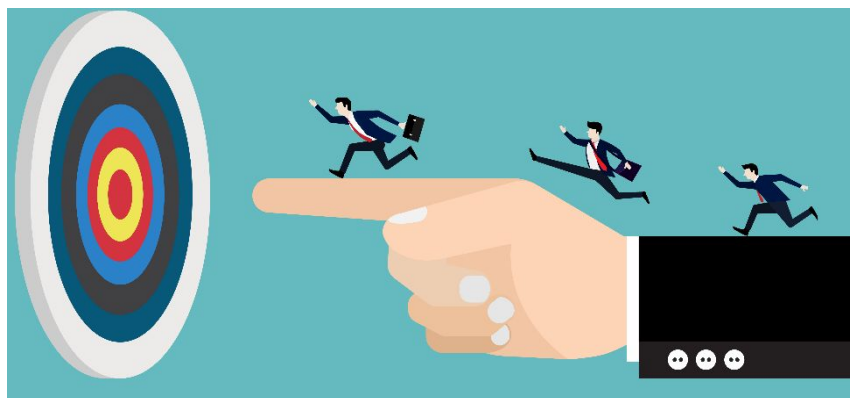
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**Important:**

It is always necessary to orientate yourself in Online banking. Take small steps and have enough time for everything. Use the basic features first and add more steps over time. It is always possible to contact your bank by phone to find out how to resolve the issue. In a few weeks you will be able to use your banking.



## Online banking and security

This section focuses on security rules for the full and safe use of Online Banking. This will allow us to use Online Banking anytime, anywhere. Life becomes easier. All recommendations can be summarized in ten major safety rules.

It is important to pay close attention to this part. First you need to prepare your device that is connected to the Internet and then you can be ready for everything. **If you are not sure that everything is ready, do not hesitate to contact an expert or a member of your family who has experience with everything.**
