UN-PROOF HIGHER EDUCATION

What do you need to know?



The UN Convention on the rights of persons with a disability (CRPD), which took effect in the Netherlands on 14 July 2016, is designed to improve the position of people with a disability. The CRPD assumes inclusion, personal autonomy and full participation.

Who plays a key role?

- + People with a disability the CRPD requires that people with a disability contribute to the decision-making process for creating policy, legislation and implementa**tion.**

 - the government makes laws, implements policy and ensures + The government that others likewise comply with the obligations of the CRPD. The Netherlands Institute for Human Rights
 - the Institute monitors the CRPD in the Netherlands and + investigates individual complaints about admission and adaptations.

What does this mean for higher education institutes?

The content of the CRPD (article 24) applies to all education institutes. They are required to actively promote the inclusion of students with a disability. This means that they must make adaptations and ensure general accessibility to buildings and information systems.

Create commitment
